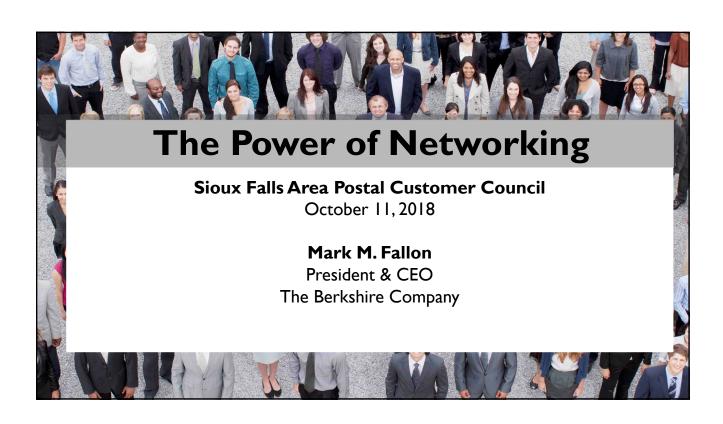

Where do you network?

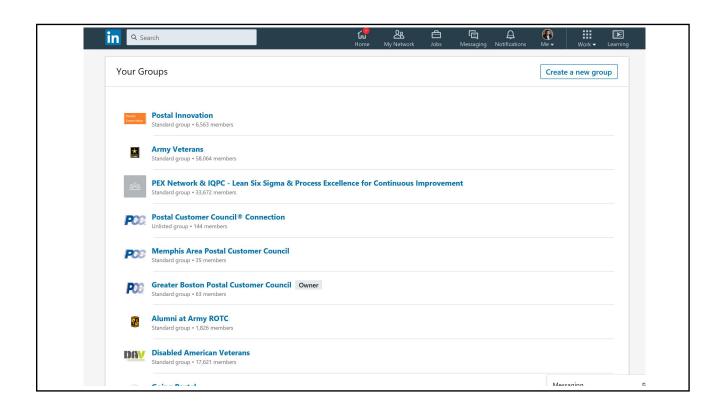

- Everywhere!

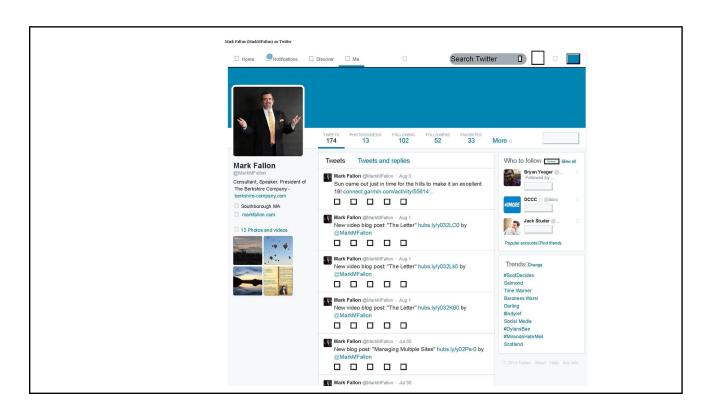
Professional Associations

- People like to be asked, so ask them!

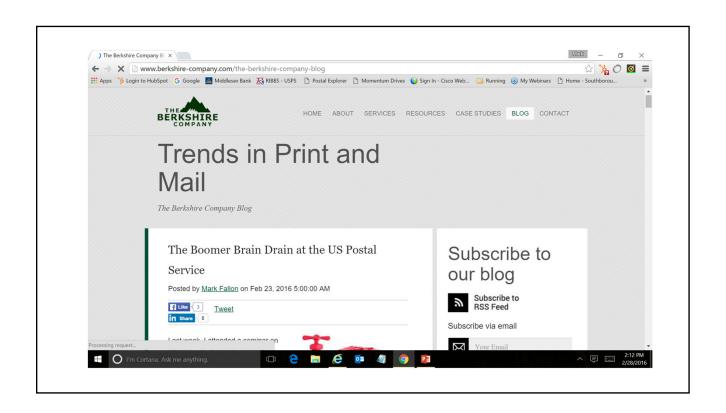

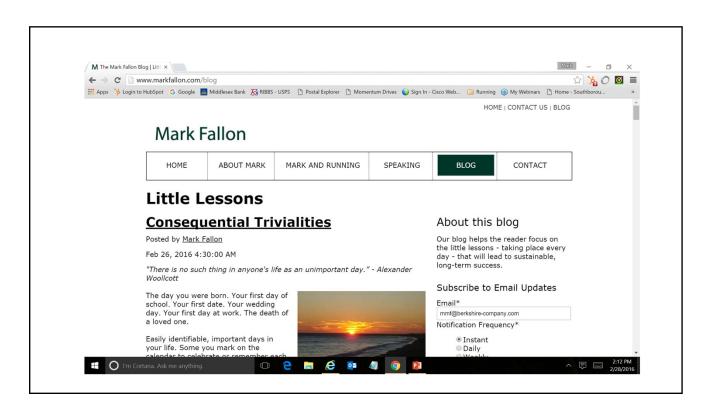
- Multiple channels LinkedIn, Twitter, Facebook

- Think before you post the Internet is forever!

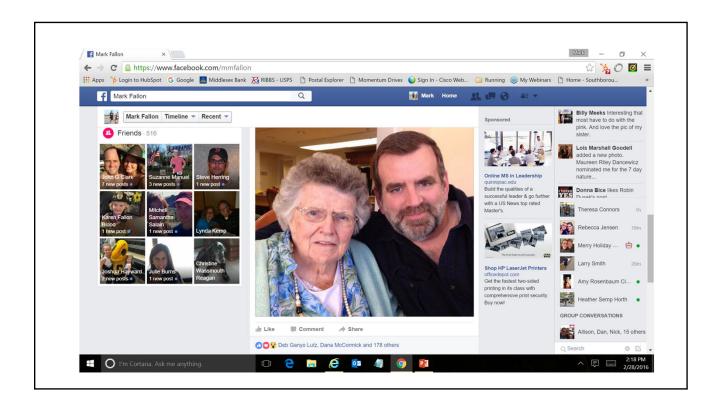
